Dear Parents:

As shared at both Back-To-School Night and the recent PTO meeting, the newly formatted Bogert Bulletin is going to house more information in order to reduce the number of emails being sent home. In fact, this newsletter contains information that would have been sent in eight separate emails! *Therefore, it's imperative that you carefully read this once-a-month bulletin or you will risk missing information that's important to you and your children*. We



will gradually be relying more and more on <u>Bogert's Facebook page</u> for the photos of events that historically have been included in the Bogert Bulletin.

Bogert students will be participating in Halloween festivities at school on Tuesday, October 31. Beginning at 1:20, students will walk around the parade route, which will be in front of Bogert in the parking lot and the "kiss and drop" lanes. Afterwards, students will return to their classrooms and enjoy their class party for the rest of the afternoon.

- Children who wish to wear a costume should plan on changing into it at school. Costumes should be simple and low maintenance (i.e. no make-up). Children who arrive at school in costume will be required to change.
- The parade is intended for the students to assemble as a school community in order to see each other's costumes. Those parents who wish to see their child in costume are invited to stand along the parade route, which will be clearly marked in the front of Bogert.
- Parents are asked to remain outside the building and may not wear costumes or masks.
- The traffic and parking situation will likely be difficult. You are asked to follow the directions of the school officials who are helping with parking.

Costumes (including accessories) of a violent or excessively frightening nature are not acceptable and are the antithesis of our commitment to provide a safe and comfortable school environment. Remember: some costumes are just not appropriate for school, even though they may be completely acceptable to wear while trick-or-treating around town.

Finally, it was great to see so many of you at Back-To-School Night. I hope the evening left you with a strong feeling that your children are in great hands and have much to look forward to this year. Please don't hesitate to contact any staff member should you need additional information or have any questions about our programs, philosophies, procedures, or curricula - we are all here to help!

As shared at Back-To-School Night and at the PTO meeting, signups for all clubs are included in this newsletter. This will be the only opportunity to sign up for clubs for the year, so I encourage you to read through the options, <u>discuss with your child his/her interests</u>,



and sign up by the firm deadline, which is **October 8**. Please understand that this new procedure is an attempt to be as equitable and inclusive as possible. While your child might not get his/her first choice, we will work to get him/her one of the three selections. Once every child has been placed, we can consider placing children in multiple clubs. Finally, if your child is interested in chorus and/or the musical, s/he can participate in these activities in addition to a club, provided you understand there will be occasional scheduling conflicts.

Our goal is to be allow every child who wants to be in a club to have at least one opportunity to do so. This is a new procedure for us, so please have patient if it's not perfect; we will be reflective. You can sign up your child for chorus, the musical, and/or a club here.


